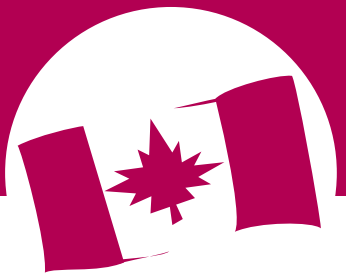

## INSTRUCTION SHEET

### **INSTRUCTIONS:**

Can be used as a scanning comprehension exercise, reading comprehension check, or review. Reinforces finding “just the facts” and follows the format of many newspaper and broadcasting articles.

**REQUIRED VOCABULARY:** *W5, elect, apply, citizen, responsibility, municipality*

**GROUP SIZE:** individual (for stronger students), pairs (for students needing assistance)

### **FOLLOW-UP ACTIVITIES:**

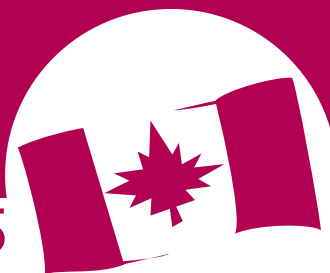
Students make up W5 questions from other reading passages.
