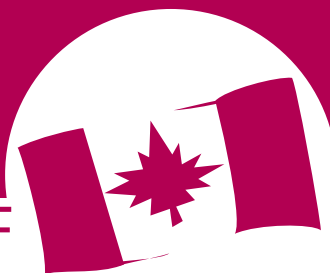

### INSTRUCTION SHEET

#### **INSTRUCTIONS:**

May be used as a preview to the section, or a comprehension check during or after the reading passage. Numbers 4 and 7 are somewhat ambiguous and should elicit group discussion. Students can check their own answers in the Newcomers' Guide to reinforce the material.

**REQUIRED STRUCTURES:** agreeing and disagreeing, modals (may and must)

**REQUIRED VOCABULARY:** *right, responsibility, hold....a job, obey, access, serve on a jury*

**GROUP SIZE:** individual (for stronger students) or pairs (for students needing assistance)

**HANDOUTS:** True or False? worksheet

**OTHER MATERIALS REQUIRED:** Newcomers' Guide text, p.28-29

**RELATED GRAMMAR:** modals

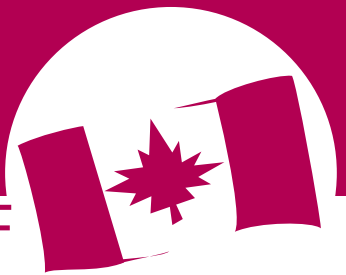
#### **FOLLOW-UP ACTIVITIES:**
