INSTRUCTION SHEET

INSTRUCTIONS:

Remember “Show and Tell” from elementary school? Having students show and explain their hobby gives them an opportunity to share an element of their lives that might not come up in regular classroom participation. Sharing hobbies and interests further builds community and lets students shine in non-linguistic ways.

This activity can be organized in several ways; you may have a whole class day dedicated to presentations, or you may have a few students share each day. Students should be encouraged to bring in samples of their work, or photos of them doing their activity

REQUIRED STRUCTURES: demonstrating “This is....”, “Here is....” etc.

REQUIRED VOCABULARY: depending on students’ activities

GROUP SIZE: small or large group

HANDOUTS: none

OTHER MATERIALS REQUIRED: realia of students’ activities

RELATED GRAMMAR: demonstratives, subject-verb agreement

FOLLOW-UP ACTIVITIES:

If appropriate, a student may want to demonstrate how to do the activity, with other students either watching or trying it for themselves.
